Peekaboo's Happy Home!

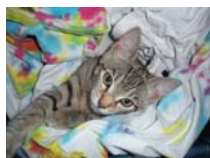

Starr Gets a New Lease on Life!

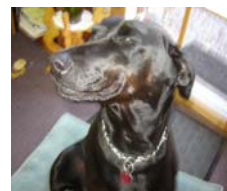
